Children's Hospital Foundation

The purpose of the Children's Hospital Foundation is "to further the physical, mental and social well-being of children and their families in Eastern Ontario and Western Quebec by raising, managing and disbursing funds."

1998 was the Foundation's most successful year ever. The Foundation raised \$7.2 million, thanks, in a large part, to the success of our investment program, CHEO's Dream of a Lifetime lottery and the gift planning program.

Other programs also received generous support. During the year, more than 100 special events were held for CHEO. These ranged from dances to barbecues and included events as widely known as Le Tour Nortel, the Kiwanis Duck Race for Tiny Hearts sponsored by Farmboy, and Charithon softball marathon.

Each year, the Foundation's main event is the CJOH Telethon for CHEO. Our Telethon is part of the North America wide Children's Miracle Network. All funds raised locally benefit CHEO. In 1998, the Telethon raised a record \$2.5 million.

Funds raised by the Children's Hospital Foundation provide extras to the Hospital making a good facility into a world-class health centre. An example of this was CHEO's acquisition of a magnetic resonance imaging suite in 1998 thanks to community support.

Each year, the Hospital identifies major areas that require funding. These have traditionally fallen into the following areas:

- Research start-up grants,
- Equipment,
- Fellowships and staff education,
- Family emergency needs and
- Enhancements to the paediatric nature of CHEO including books, toys, games, etc.

The Hospital and the Foundation Board collaborate to distribute the funds where the needs are greatest. In the past few years, the Hospital has given priority to replacing and upgrading aging equipment. The Resource Allocation Committee of the Medical Advisory Committee reviews submissions for new pieces of equipment and attempts to establish the priorities.

The Foundation also commits approximately \$300,000 per year to the CHEO Research Institute for distribution to researchers starting new projects. The Research Institute's Science Committee awards these funds. The CHEO Research Building houses laboratories where research into audiology, neonatology, genetics, paediatric kidney disease, psychology, psychiatry, and orthopedics takes place.

Occasionally, the Hospital identifies a special project or piece of equipment that would require additional funding. Then, the Chair of the Hospital's Board of Trustees and the President of the Hospital may ask to make a presentation to the Foundation Board of Directors for special consideration. The Foundation Board gave the MRI special consideration.

Foundation funding also helps enhance the paediatric nature of the Hospital. This is accomplished through improvements to the physical environment such as child-friendly decorations and play parks.

Some funding is also made available to the CHEO Social Work department for families who are in crisis and need short-term financial assistance to make it through a difficult period.

In summary, the Foundation provides most funding to the Hospital on a priority basis.

MRI: the crown jewel in CHEO's diagnostic imaging unit

On March 25, 1998, the Children's Hospital of Eastern Ontario took another step in its continuing efforts to deliver quality paediatric care with the purchase of a state-of-the-art diagnostic instrument - the Magnetic Resonance Imaging unit.

The \$2.2-million MRI unit is now housed on the main level of the Hospital. The MRI uses radio waves and a magnetic field to detect medical problems, such as heart conditions, spinal cord injuries, sports injuries, and neurological and bone marrow diseases.



Before the MRI unit was installed at CHEO, patients had to be transported to the Ottawa General Hospital. More than half of the children had to be sedated at CHEO before being transported. Some children were too ill to endure the ordeal.

"Now, we have a sedation room adjacent to the MRI suite," says Wendy Rabbie, operations director, diagnostic imaging patient service unit. "The child is sedated and only moved 10 feet to our MRI room rather than sedating here at CHEO and rolling the child on a gurney to the General."

Rabbie says the new MRI unit logs an average of 40 hours a week of diagnostic testing. "Urgent cases can undergo testing right away instead of competing with adult cases at a very busy MRI unit at the General," says Rabbie.

The MRI unit is another example of how the Foundation's funding enhances CHEO's ability to provide quality paediatric care to our children.
