SEPTEMBER IS CHILDHOOD CANCER AWARENESS MONTH

At any given time, there are over 500 children battling cancer at CHEO per year. Some of those patients are in active treatment while others are in after care programs.

Currently, both childhood and adult cancers are treated primarily through chemotherapy, radiation and often surgery. These therapies have significant side effects, especially for children who can suffer with lifelong problems related to their cancer treatment. For this reason, scientists at CHEO and around the world have been working to find targeted therapies that kill cancer more effectively while causing fewer side effects. Community support has helped CHEO Research Institute scientists take the important step of moving their cutting-edge research, dedicated to developing less harmful therapies, into human clinical trial.

One of these researchers is Dr. Robert Korneluk. He and his team have discovered that combining agents proven to stimulate the body's natural immune response using drugs known as Smac mimetics, show better cancer killing rates in laboratory testing than if either therapy is used on its own.

In addition to the effect on tumor cells, this course of treatment keeps the body's healthy cells intact thereby improving the lives of patients. This work represents a significant evolution in the field of immunotherapy, which is already showing promise in the fight against various cancers including lymphoma, melanoma and lung cancer.

Being able to test and gather data over time to bring Dr. Korneluk's research to human clinical trials was made possible in large part because of direct donor support. Stay tuned for further updates on this critical work.

Scott's story

The Scott Tokessy Memorial Gold Glove Tournament was established in 1996 in memory of Scott, a popular twelve year-old boy who

died suddenly of an irregular heartbeat after hitting a home run for his Kanata house league team in May of that year. Since inception, the tournament has raised over \$395,000 to support CHEO's cardiology equipment and research.

To this day, the Tokessy family participates in the planning of the tournament. You can find them at the main field watching the games and thanking the numerous volunteers who support this meaningful event.
