Dr. Myette studies a disease called Nephrotic Syndrome, which affects around 2 in every 10,000 children in Canada. While considered rare, we currently care for hundreds of children here at CHEO.

Will you help us train the next generation of medical professionals?

We need one new simulation doll for CHEO's SIM lab.

Have you ever wondered how doctors and nurses safely gain real-life practice with medical procedures on young children and babies?

One way is by using a state-of-the-art simulation (SIM) lab, equipped with a simulation doll like the one you see here, that can mimic pediatric patients.

While it might look like a child's toy, this doll has a lot more going on than meets the eye!

At a cost of around \$78,000, it is well-equipped to showcase many real-life emergency symptoms and vital signs.

The doll's chest moves, its eyes blink, it can have seizures, cry, or show symptoms of not getting enough oxygen as its lips turn blue.

As a leading teaching hospital, CHEO depends on the SIM lab to safely teach and train healthcare professionals, as well as patient families. More than 1,700 people have used the lab to date!

This lab isn't just for practicing emergency situations. CHEO staff also use the lab to test out new equipment and develop new safety procedures.

We need to add a new simulation doll to meet the need for more training. Will you help?
